



## Wigan Music Service Whole Class Instrumental Lessons at Home GUITAR

## Listen Up!

This lesson we will focus on one of the **Musical Elements** called **Pulse**.

Music has a pulse just like we have a pulse in our bodies, do you know what makes that pulse...? Yes! It's our heart. Another word for pulse is 'Beat'.

Here is a video clip which explains a little more about pulse, ask your parents to show you the video clip.

- 1. Clap the pulse along when the music starts, make sure you stay in time with the guitar.
- 2. How do we group the beats in the video? In 3? In 4? In 5?.
- 3. Listen to some music of your own and find the pulse.

Now let's make some music! If you have your guitar at home try the work written in Blue. If you've not got your guitar at home try the work in Orange (even if you do have your guitar you could do the work in Orange!).



Play 4 'B's (Bunny String), then Play 4 'A's, then 4 'G's (Goes string)

Remember A is on the Goes at the  $2^{nd}$  fret with the  $2^{nd}$  finger see picture.

Keep the **Pulse** steady don't get faster and don't get slower. Can you be like a clock ticking steady?

Count a steady 1 2 3 4, 1 2 3 4, 1 2 3 4.

Don't get faster and don't get slower keep the **pulse** steady like a clock.

Every time you say beat 1 clap! *Clap 2 3 4, Clap 2 3 4, Clap 2 3 4.* Watch the video in 'Investigate' for ideas on sounds for other beats.
