Listen Up!

In this lesson we will look at one of the **Musical Elements** called **Pitch**.

Pitch is how high or low a note sounds, a mouse squeaks with a high Pitch but a lion roars with a low Pitch. On our guitars each string has a different Pitch.

Ask your Parents to show you the video from BBC Bitesize which is all about **Pitch** and **Melody**. Think about:

- 1) Which is the highest pitched string on our guitars?
- 2) Which is the Lowest pitched string on our guitars?
- 3) How do we change the pitch on our guitar strings?

 - b) In my **Melody** which note (**Pitch**) do I start and end with, is it. G, A, B or C?

 - a) What tips does Bob give to make a sweet melody?
 - b) Does Bob say have a long melody or a short melody?
