
Rossini was an Italian composer who was born in 1792 and died in 1868. Rossini wrote lots of music for **operas**. He was very lazy and would often leave his work until the last minute before finishing it. He once had to have someone from the opera company lock him in his room until he finished writing!

**Operas** are long works that are like films. Lots of your favourite Disney films that have songs are like opera, except in opera, there is no talking amongst the characters. Everything is sung! They usually tell a story about heroes or love. Listen again to William Tell. What story do you think is being told? Use your imagination!
