What is tempo? It is an important part of every piece of music and can change how a piece of music sounds and feels.

We can play short or long notes and this is the duration of the notes. The speed of the music is tempo.

Warm up playing some notes on your instrument. Can you remember hot cross buns from the first work sheet? Play hot cross buns very slowly then as fast as you can and see what you think? Did changing the tempo change how much you liked the piece of music?

Listen Up!

Tempo can be used to change the feel of a piece music and help the composer to musically represent something. A composer called Saint-Saens uses different tempos in carnival of the animals to help represent different animals. Would you choose a fast or slow tempo for a cat, snail, hippo?!

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Make Some Music

We are going to learn the notes for the chorus of mamma mia. You are going to need an extra note. Descants C and Trebles F.

It is the same fingering for both recorders;

On Descants the fingering in the box is a C

On Trebles the fingering in the box is an F

These are the notes for Descant recorder:

AGAG GGABAG AG C-CCCB G X2

These are the notes for Treble recorder:

DCDC CCDEDC DC F-FFFEC X2

Practise playing at a slow tempo and gradually speed up till you can play it at a fast tempo!
