


Owls' Class Blog 7.5.21

Alesha disagrees. Alesha said, "I predict that there will be another twist! The main character, Johnny Trott, is going to die."


This book is highly recommended by Owls' Class and if you want to find out how it ends, you'll have to read it for yourself!




Top Tip for choosing your next book!

Don't judge a book by its cover – read the first sentence instead:


The best time to talk to ghosts is just before the sun comes up...




Marley was dead: to begin with...




