

A Message from the Archbishop

My thanks go to all who have worked so hard to get teams of cleaners and stewards together in order that our churches can continue to be opened for Mass, other liturgical celebrations, and private prayer. I have witnessed recently the energy and enthusiasm of some our volunteers, but I also know that much of the work that goes on is done unseen. Please do pass on my deepest thanks to all our volunteers. So much is possible when we work together, when we pray and discern together, when we reflect together, that it becomes a living out of our Synod journey in a concrete and substantive way. I hope that this energy and enthusiasm continues, despite the uncertainties about the future.

Coronavirus Update

As most of the Archdiocese is now under not just national rulings but also local lockdown regulations, from **Monday 28th September** the following will apply:

- **1. Baptisms**: There can only be 6 people present (the rule of 6 applies.)
- 2. Weddings: There can only be 15 in the Church and for the reception.
- **3. Funerals:** The number remains at 30 (at the Crematorium, the number is 20 in the Chapel). Apart from the immediate family, those attending funerals will be asked to take their seats in Church before the Service begins.
- **4. 1st Communions**: Small groups (not more than 6 people) are allowed to celebrate 1st Communions within a special Mass. As the arrangements that we had already made fall within this criteria, the 1st Communion celebrations planned for the next two weeks will go ahead.
- **5. QR Codes**: The new track and trace NHS app asks that places of worship set up a QR bar code and have it on posters around the entrances to churches so that people can use a smart phone to register their presence.

Each of our Churches now has its own unique QR code which you will find on posters at the entrance to the Church.

Once again, I would remind you that we are only able to open our Churches at all thanks to the generosity of those who have volunteered to steward and clean the Churches before and after services. They have now been doing so continuously for 3 months. As more people are now coming back to Mass, I would ask you once again to consider whether you can give some time to help in this regard.

Synod Sunday

The weekend of the 18th October was to have seen to meeting of the Archdiocesan Synod which has now been postponed until June next year. The same weekend will, however, be marked as Synod Sunday when there will be further information about the work of the Synod and a list of the summary proposals.

Further to the introduction of the new Cemetery Regulations, the £30 Maintenance Fee for this year is now due. This can be paid by cash or cheque made payable to 'St. Oswald's Parish' and handed into the Parish Office. Please include the name of the deed-holder and either the Plot number (if known) or details of those interred in the grave.

To assist with the maintenance of the cemetery, there is now a green bin (for **garden waste only**) and a black bin (for all other waste). Please help to improve the appearance of the cemetery by using the correct bin, as you would do at home.
