

COVID Restrictions

Once again, I would like to re-iterate my thanks to all those who played a part in our celebration of the Holy Week liturgies. Unfortunately, due to increased numbers wishing to attend, it was necessary, for the first time, to close the Church doors on Sunday morning, having reached the capacity allowed. Hopefully this will not happen again but, with people no longer shielding, this cannot be guaranteed.

May I therefore remind you that there is a limit on the numbers who can be admitted to each Church, based on social-distancing guidelines. This limit is 140 at St.Oswald's, 100 at Our Lady's and 75 at St. Wilfrid's. When this number has been reached, there is no option but for us to close the doors. Without going into the rights and wrongs of the matter, you will all have seen what happened in London on Good Friday, and I am not

prepared to put in jeopardy the efforts of so many people who have helped to keep our Churches open since last June.

Before Easter, the 11.00am Mass at St. Oswald's was beginning to reach its capacity, but there was still space at the other Masses, particularly on Saturday and Sunday evenings. It would, therefore, be sensible to make sure you arrive in plenty of time.

Although certain restrictions are being lifted, the Coronavirus is still with us, and there are some things, such as social-distancing, which we still have to do, at least for the time being. In asking you to sit in certain places, our stewards are doing only what they been asked to do, and I would ask that you continue to co-operate with them. This is a small price to pay for being able to come to Mass—any of you with family in Ireland (where there have been no public Masses since Christmas) will know what I mean.

Bethlehem Fund

Just before Easter, I was able to arrange, thanks to your generosity, for the transfer of £3000 from our Bethlehem Fund to the Franciscan Parish in Bethlehem. This week, I received the following letter from the Parish Priest, Fr Rami.
