

COVID Guidelines

Further guidance has been received this week regarding the steps which need to be taken following Stage 3 of the Government's Coronavirus Response Roadmap. As a general principle, all places of worship are always to consider the prevailing local conditions for the virus. This means that, after consultation, the Archbishop has decided that, due to the prevalence of the Indian variant in the North West, we should keep certain restrictions in place in the Diocese. This is particularly important for those who may be returning to Mass for the first time, but also serves as a timely reminder to everyone as to what is required. Therefore

- 1. The use of hand gel on entering and leaving Church will continue.
- 2. Face coverings are required, unless there is a medical exemption.
- 3. The sanitising of benches after each service will continue, therefore stewards will show you to your place, filling up from the front of the Church.
 - 4. Single-use Mass sheets are to be taken away at the end of Mass, not left in Church.
 - 5. Congregational singing is still prohibited.
- 6. Holy Communion will continue to be under one kind only, and at the end of Mass. The Minister of Holy Communion will once again announce "The Body of Christ" for each communicant. Please leave the Church immediately after receiving Communion and do not return to your bench.
 - 7. Baptisms and weddings are still limited to 30 participants, but for funerals the number will be the Covid-secure capacity for each Church.
 - 8. Home visits to the sick and housebound will shortly recommence.

Obviously it is hoped that, in a few weeks, many of these restrictions can be replaced, but this is by no means certain. In the meantime, your continued co-operation is greatly appreciated.
