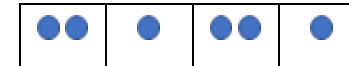

Last time, we made some rhythms using the words **bean** and **flower**.
This was mine from last week

Flower bean flower bean



This time, I'm going to use dots instead of pictures, one dot for **bean** and two dots for **flower**. It will look like this



I wonder if you can Clap this pattern.



That's right, it says **bean, bean, flower, bean.**

Now it's time to play a game with someone in your home.

Write down a rhythm using dots like the one we have played today.

Keep it hidden and play it for your adult.

See if they can guess the rhythm pattern that you wrote down.

Then, it's your adults turn to write down a secret rhythm to play for you!

You could use your shaker!

Let's Get Creative!

One of the most important parts of the story of Jack and the Beanstalk is the Beanstalk itself! Here is how to make one.

1. Roll up a couple of sheets of thin paper and hold in place with tape.



2. Flatten at one end and tear down the middle for about 10 cm.



3. Turn the tube and flatten it again. Tear down 10 cm to make the leaves.



4. Unflatten the tube and push the leaves back.



5. Pull very gently on one of the inside leaves and the beanstalk should start to grow!



6. See how tall you can make your beanstalk grow.



You could try using newspaper for an even bigger beanstalk!

Extra fun

As you will see in the next part of the story the beanstalk begins to grow.

We used our guiros last week to make the sound of the beanstalk creaking and growing. This week we can make sounds for when it is low to the ground and when it grows up high into the clouds.

In music you can make low sounds and high sounds.
Have a look at this piano

If you press the red spot you can record what you play. Press the blue triangle to listen back.



This is the low pitch end of the piano

This is the high pitch end of the piano

See if you can make the sound of Jack climbing up the beanstalk by playing each note from low pitch to high. Press the little picture of the piano first. Start on the red C then play D E F G A B and end on the pink C.

Can you make him climb down again by starting at the high pitch end and going down to the low pitch end?

Try out the different animal sounds and listen to the pitch change when you play different letters.
