

Listen Up!

Welcome back to Time for Music.

Here is another film for you to watch.
It is a piece of music by Kerry Andrew called
No Place Like

It is quite similar to *Connect It* from last week because it doesn't use traditional instruments. Kerry uses body percussion and beat boxing just like Anna Meredith did, but she includes singing too.

Children from all over the country were asked to send in short phrases that made them think of home. Kerry used this information to help her to write her lyrics.

Let's Get Creative!

Now it's your turn to create a **sound scape** inspired by *No Place Like*.

Think of phrases that remind you of home. Here are some of Kerry Andrew's lyrics.

My home makes me feel like me, A hive of people busy as bees

Write down some words that make you think of home. Who lives there? How does it make you feel? Anything at all that you would like to include. Try to put them into short sentences.

When you are happy with the words that you have chosen, it's time to add more sounds. On this website you can add some atmospheric background music.

There are two settings, morning and evening, and for each one you can add lots of musical elements including rhythms using the buttons on the side.

*Read your lyrics clearly over the top of the music

*Add any extra sounds that you like, including body percussion or beat boxing.

*You have now created a soundscape all about your home!



Keywords

Soundscape - Make sounds to mimic a real or imaginary environment. You can use voices, bodies and other objects that you have found.

Lyrics - the words that you sing or say in a song.

Explore

It's time to think about your idea of home.

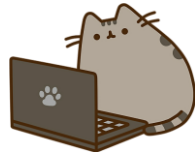
What sounds can you hear?

They all make sounds, you just need to stop and listen.
