Can you hear the wood block playing the pulse?



The wood block is found in the percussion family of an orchestra. It can make short, loud sounds. This makes it really good for keeping the pulse in an orchestra because everyone can hear it!

Minimalism - an arts movement from the 1960's Tempo - the speed of the piece of music

Let's Get Creative!

Time to get minimal!

We need to Create the short, repeating phrases that will be layered over each other.

Have a look at this Clip for a bit of inspiration.

You need to start by counting 1,2,3,4 1,2,3,4 in your head. This is the pulse.

Try tapping Ta Ta Ta along to the pulse.

Next, try Ti-Ti, Ti-Ti, Ti-Ti You will see that you are clapping twice as fast!

Ta has one sound so I'm going to write a symbol like this

Ti - Ti has two sounds so it's symbol will look like this

Let's Mix them up to make some rhythms, working in fours.



See how many different rhythms you can compose working in fours using Ta and Ti-Ti. Try to use the symbols to write them down.

Find objects that make sounds of short duration to play them on.

Minimalism was a whole movement that included music and art too. It became very popular in the 1960's.

Minimalism uses repetition. In music, it can be rhythms played over and over again, Changing gradually to make a hypnotic effect.

In art, Minimalism uses simple shapes, like triangles and squares.

Sometimes their work was just in black and white and sometimes in bright colours.

This is a picture called **Hyena Stomp.**It is by the minimalist artist **Frank Stella.** Check out more of his work and the work of other artists by following this link.
