Start listening from 7 minutes and 15 seconds.

It was written by a man called John Williams and it comes from a film called **Close Encounters of the Third Kind**.
In the story a huge spaceship comes to Earth and scientists talk to the aliens using music.



The humans on Earth look tiny to the aliens just like Jack does to the Giant. In this piece of music, the humans are making the **high pitch** sounds.

The space ship is really big just like the giant in our story. So when the aliens answer they make very **low pitch** sounds.

Every time you hear the high pitch humans, stretch up as tall as you can and wave to the aliens.

When you hear the low pitch sounds, crouch down to the ground like the aliens looking down to Earth.

It goes faster and faster, see if you can keep up!
