Line 1 has 5 syllables,

Line 2 has 7 syllables,

Line 3 has 5 syllables.

## Extra fun

Origami is an ancient art form. Ori means "folding", and kami meaning "paper". Paper was first invented in China around 105 A.D., and was brought to Japan by monks in the sixth century. Handmade paper was very expensive, so it was only available to a few people, and paper folding in ancient Japan was strictly for ceremonial purposes.

It can be very tricky when you first start to learn, so don't give up!
