Let's get Creative!

'The Firebird' was composed for a ballet.

The ballet is based on 'The Firebird' from Russian folklore: a mythical creature, the firebird, helps the hero.

The music is a celebration of their victory and represents the Firebird.

The melody/leitmotif Stravinsky composed to represent 'The Firebird' used just the notes C, D, E, F and G.

Why not compose a melody/leitmotif that suits your favourite bird?

leitmotif – a recurrent theme tune throughout a musical composition, associated with **a particular person/character**, idea, or situation.

Playing with sounds:

Use the notes CDEF and G

If you have a synthesizer/keyboard/recorder etc. - lucky you - use it © If you don't, find one on-line. Here are some examples https://www.musicca.com/piano

Create your own **leitmotif** to suit your favourite bird.



- 1. Choose a bird (you can invent your own)
- 2. Decide whether your **bird** is big/small, good/bad, cowardly/brave, bouncy/slow etc.
- 3. Play around with different Instrumental sounds and pitches to find the best sound for your bird.
 - 4. You can alter your leitmotif by changing:

Pitch (high/low sounds)
Tempo (fast/slow sounds)
Dynamics (loud/quiet)
Texture (smooth long/short spikey sounds)

5. When you are happy with your LEITMOTIF **record it** (there might be someone in your household who is techy)
