This coming Sunday, your parish church will be celebrating a great and joyful feast, Pentecost Sunday. It is the feast of the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church, a gift which we now receive at Baptism, Confirmation, and at Mass.

In this Sunday's Gospel, the risen Jesus offers his disciples the Holy Spirit and inner peace so that they would never be alone, to strengthen them, and to be their helper forever. Jesus never wants us to be fearful, lonely, or disturbed, and he also offers us the gift of the Holy Spirit.

This true, lasting peace, offered by Jesus (the removal of all anxiety, worry, and envy), comes only from God. It is not dependent on peaceful conditions; we can experience it even in the midst of turmoil and uncertainty.

Enjoy a very special time together this evening, hearing your child's thoughts about this Sunday's Gospel and this Wednesday's word, which is **PENTECOST**.

PENTECOST

The word 'Pentecost' means 'fiftieth day'. On this day (fifty days after Easter) the apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit - the third person of the Holy Trinity. Pentecost is not just a historical event. The Holy Spirit is alive and active today. Ask your child what they have learnt at school about the Gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church at Pentecost. It may help your child if you tell them something that you know about Pentecost.

The Holy Spirit is our helper and helps us to live more like Jesus, to do good things and be filled with the love, truth, happiness and peace which come from God. As a family, discuss and choose special ways in which you can be helpful to each other in this coming week. Perhaps you can: make your bed and keep your room tidy; set the table and help each other with the dishes. Is there anyone who may especially need your help?

3 * Simply repeating the words 'Come, Holy Spirit' is a great prayer to say as you finish tonight's Together Time, and also at anytime throughout each day. *

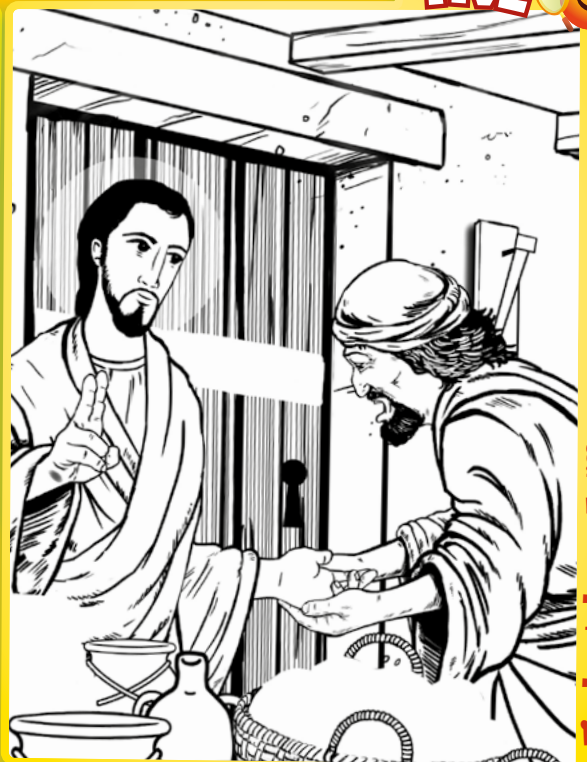
