Online Safety Concerns

I am aware that some parents have received an alert from Cleveland Police which came via their child's sports club. This was related to the use of WhatsApp and particularly related to Year 7 pupils being encouraged to join a certain group which was then sharing alarming messages including pornography, threatening behaviour and self-harm.

School have not received this alert; however, it is a timely reminder to everyone about the importance of keeping children safe in the online world. If your child has a mobile phone or uses devices at home, please ensure that you know what they are accessing online and the apps they have installed. As parents you should have secure settings and you should know the age restrictions of apps and games. WhatsApp has an age restriction of 16+ We are also aware that children often have access to You Tube rather than Kids You Tube. We also know from talking to children that many of them have access to devices in their bedrooms including mobile phones. Please be alert to the dangers of the online world.

The monthly online safety newsletters we send to you will support and guide, as will our website.

If you have any concerns or require any help with settings, then please do not hesitate to contact myself or Mrs Cooke who is our Online Safety Lead.

Uniform and equipment

Thank you for ensuring that your child is ready for school each day in their winter uniform. A polite reminder to the very few children who are not wearing correct uniform that shirt/blouse and tie is part of our winter uniform. PLEASE CHECK UNIFORM TO ENSURE IT IS LABELLED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.

Please also ensure that your child is only bringing their St Paul's School water bottle for classroom use. Please ensure that your child's name is on the bottle (a permanent marker pen is a great investment for labelling both uniform and water bottles). If you need to purchase a new bottle then please do so at the school office. They cost £3 (cash please).
