Virtues Award Winners 2025




We were very proud to be able to present our 'Virtues Awards' to recognise children in our school who are a shining example of the way to live our Trust Virtues.

School Uniform

Equipment for School

We do not require children to bring any equipment into school from home. All items needed are provided by school, including a reading folder or book bag and a school water bottle.

Children should only bring a bag from home if absolutely essential—space is very limited inside cloakrooms and it is much tidier and safer if bags are not cluttering this space.

Phones should not be brought into school unless essential e.g.: if your child is walking home alone, and must be handed into the school office on arrival. Thank you for your co-operation.

School Meals and Packed Lunches

Our school catering team offer an excellent choice of menus for lunchtime meals. Menus are available on the school website under the Parents & Pupils tab and the cost is great value at £2.75 per day.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 do not need to pay as Universal Infant Free School meals are available.

Please check your eligibility for free school meals (even if your child is in Nursery, Reception, Y1 or Y2) as the school may be able to claim some additional funding which can
