
Endings and New Beginnings...

School Uniform

When our children return to school in September they may still wear their summer uniform, if they wish. When you purchase shoes please ensure they are well-fitting, black school shoes. Simple hair accessories like bobbles or slides may be worn, preferably in plain colours.

Hairstyles should not be extreme—dyed or highlighted hair, shaved heads or tram lines are not allowed.

Remember a water bottle every day as well as a sun hat if the summer is still with us in September! If your child brings a packed lunch they need a drink and also a water bottle for the classroom, which should be filled with fresh water or sugarfree squash.







School Meals and Packed Lunches

The price of a school meal will remain at £2.20 per day/£11.00 per week. Universal free school meal entitlement continues for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. Even though you do not have to pay for school meals for pupils of this age but you think you may be eligible for free school meals you can check by visiting https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals/stockton-ontees and if you are eligible the school can claim additional funding which will be used to support your child's education.

If you are providing your child with a packed lunch, we ask you to consider healthy options. All packed lunches should contain fruit or vegetables. Only one treat like a cake or biscuit should be included. A drink should be provided – water, fruit juice or squash please, no fizzy drinks.
