#### Headteacher Message

Good afternoon,

It has been an extremely busy school week, with lots of lovely learning taking place. This week we have been checking on reading and history across the school. We saw wonderful phonics lessons in EYFS and KS1, we heard children read from EYFS – Y6 and talked to them about their choice of books, how they are doing and how often they are reading. It was really positive! Reading across school will always be a priority as it provides a strong foundation for other subjects. Please keep reading with your child at home. I have told Y3 that I will be popping in on a regular basis to listen to them read and for them to tell me all about what they have been reading.

Our curriculum is continually developing and is knowledge rich! This was evident through discussions with Y1/2 who shared lots of historical knowledge about The Great Fire of London with me, Y4 who astounded me with their knowledge of life in Ancient Egypt and Y6 who talked to Mrs Parker and Mr Carter about their unit on early Islamic civilization of Baghdad. It was also wonderful to hear that the children are keen to learn more and very often will go home and do their own independent research.

Today Y6 led a thoughtful Remembrance worship. Thank you to all the Y6 children and staff for working hard and speaking confidently in front of your audience. I also want to say a huge thank you to Mrs McGirl the Student Council who have worked so hard this week to raise money for The Royal British Legion through the sale of poppy products. They have been a credit to the school taking their roles and responsibilities extremely seriously, showing respect and tolerance.

### We are here for you...

We know that the cost of living and other factors may be causing families concerns and worries. We want to make sure that no child is at a disadvantage due to finances or circumstances. It is really important to us that we have good relationships between school and families. Mrs Rigby and staff are continuing to look at how we can best support the children and our families. As we approach the winter and Christmas period, please let us know if you need any further advice or guidance. Mrs Rigby has a network of support to refer parents to.

We are also requesting that if your home circumstances change e.g. partners going away for work, separation, change in family dynamics that you please let a key adult know. All information will be treated sensitively. The only reason we ask is that we want to ensure we are equipped to support your child(ren). Many children can find changes difficult, no matter how small these changes may be.

All children in EYFS and KS1 are entitled to a free univeral school meal. We continue to have a number of children on packed lunches. The menu has recently changed and we would encourage you to take up this offer.

Pupil Premium Funding – This is additional funding we get as a school for any children from EYFS – Y6 that may be on a lower income. (At Y3 these are the children who are entitled to a free school meal.) However, there may be children in KS1 who would also be eligible for the school to receive additional funding for through pupil premium. We really benefit from this funding and it enables us to ensure we have the high support in each classroom, it ensures we have Mrs Rigby and it also enables us to make sure all children have the best opportunities from school. If you think your child may be eligible, please speak to Suzie in the school office. Any funding coming into school really does benefit your children.

# Keeping Children Safe Online:

In the real world we protect our children. So why not keep them safe online?

An 'essential' online safety briefing for parents, guardians, and carers.

#### About the briefing

Many people, including young children are users of the internet.

Having access to online information and the functionality that the internet can offer has many benefits and for most it plays an important part of our everyday lives. However, as technology moves on at such a pace it is difficult to keep up with new trends and developments, particularly regarding mobile devices/games technology and safe accessibility to online content.

Young people are spending more time online and research shows evidence that issues relating to exploitation, manipulation or abuse are adding to concerns regarding online safety. Research now shows that life online can also have an impact on wellbeing and in some cases contribute to mental health problems.

What are our children doing online? Do we know how they are behaving? Are they safe? Who are they communicating with? Do they know what to do if they come across something suspicious? Are they accessing content appropriate for their age? Are they giving away too much personal information that may make them vulnerable or affect them in the future? Are they spending too much time online? Are we having conversations about all the above?

We would ask at least one parent/carer from each family to attend this session where a Lancashire Education Authority Consultant will present an awareness briefing to address some of the issues mentioned above. The session is for parents/carers only and will last for approximately 1hr 15mins with an opportunity for questions during or after the presentation.

The Local Authority and our school have policies in place to ensure children are learning in a safe and secure environment which includes being safe online. Therefore, this session has been organised to help you to contribute to this process in helping children to be aware of the potential problems associated with using the internet and modern technologies.

#### The session is not suitable for children

OFSTED regard these sessions as an integral part of a school's Safeguarding/Online Safety policy and they expect schools to have offered this support for parents. Please help us to keep young children safe.





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
