Happy New Year Good afternoon,

Happy New Year! It has been wonderful to welcome all the children back to school this week and get back into the routine of school.

Despite the cold weather and ice, we have had a lovely week and the children have returned to school refreshed, positive and ready for a great half term!

Today we had a wonderful opportunity to meet our local MP, Lizzi Collinge. She carried out a short visit to school to discuss some of the current educational challenges and meet our Y5 and 6 student councillors. Our councillors had the opportunity to talk about how we are developing as a school and aiming to be more sustainable and more aware of climate change. It was a great opportunity and we can't wait to invite Lizzi back later in the year to see some of our developments in action.

As a school, we are committed to supporting the training of new teachers and ensuring those who come to us for training receive high quality experiences. As many of you may be aware, there is a national shortage of teachers and a high number of teachers leave the profession in the first three years. At St Peter's, we are part of the Ripley Initial Teacher Training Programme and offer training



placements which are supervised by our highly experienced teachers and the team at Ripley. Next week we have Mr Side joining us. He will be based in the Year 5 class from January – July. Mrs Owens will continue to be the main point of contact for parents of Year 5. Over the next few months, Mr Side's teaching responsibilities will increase. We welcome him warmly to our school.

We always aim to work collaboratively with parents, to ensure their child receives every opportunity to attend school where possible. We also have the support of a new attendance officer from the local authority, who will be working with us closely to ensure we can continually improve attendance at St Peter's.


Parking Reminder

Packed Lunches and Meals

All children in EYFS – Y2 are entitled to have a universal free school meal daily. We would strongly recommend parents in these year groups to encourage your child to try a school meal. There is a variety of warm, healthy food on offer daily and it saves the cost and hassle of making a packed lunch.

We also need parents to be mindful about what they are putting in packed lunches. A packed lunch should still be healthy. Prior to Christmas we noticed a high number of packed lunches with lots of sugary items (including biscuits and chocolate bars). Children should have a healthy packed lunch which includes fruit / vegetables. One small treat can be included e.g. biscuit, we recommend that crisps are limited throughout the week, no fizzy drinks.



Chocolate spread is not allowed due to the high sugar intake and some spreads contain nuts. Juices should be low sugar.

Pupil Premium Funding

St Peter's is a small school and we rely on any funding we can get to provide the best education outcomes for all children. Schools receive additional funds for children who are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding. This is approx. £1,800 per year per child eligible for the school. It helps to fund the additional support staff we have in place and purchase new resources to ensure all children have the best opportunities. If your circumstances have changed please consider letting us know and completing the eligibility form.

Those eligible for the Pupil Premium are; any child who has received Free School Meals over the past 6 years, children who are cared for or those adopted from care and children whose parents are in the armed forces.

We may have families / children in EYFS – Y2 who are currently receiving free school meals via the universal meals, however we may be missing out additional funding if there are any families / children within these year groups that may fit the criteria above. All information is confidential. You may also be eligible for meal vouchers during the holiday periods. We would not want any family / child to be missing out on support. Please do not hesitate to contact Miss Walker to discuss further.

Florence Price








About: Florence Beatrice Price (1887 – 1953) was an American classical composer, pianist, organist and music teacher. Price is noted as the first African-American woman to be recognized as a symphonic composer, and the first to have a composition played by a major orchestra. In 2009, a substantial collection of her works and papers was found in her abandoned summer home.
