

Let's Get Talking



Chatting and listening to your child at home is really important for their language skills, confidence and communication. Simple things like telling stories, asking questions, or just having a good conversation help them pick up new words, improve their speaking, and learn how to express themselves.

Research shows that children who are exposed to more words at home, especially in the early years, develop stronger language skills and perform better in school.

Please try to spend some time chatting at home and learning new words! Challenge your child to learn a new word and it's meaning. Perhaps they could share their learning with us in school...

Is your child eligible for Pupil Premium Grant Funding?

Pupil Premium funding is extra money given to schools by the government to help improve education for children who may need it. At St Peter's we receive approx £32k per year in PPG funding. This is relatively low in comparison to other schools.

Who is eligible for Pupil Premium?

Your child may be eligible if they:

- Are currently eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) or have been at any point in the last six years. Please note, this does not include the 'universal free school meals' which every child is eligible for from EYFS to Y2.
- Are looked after (in care) or have left care through adoption, a special guardianship order, or a child arrangements order.
- Have a parent serving in the armed forces or have done so in the last six years.

How is the funding used?

Schools use Pupil Premium funding to:

- Provide extra support in reading, writing and maths through supplementing the staffing costs.
- Support the cost of educational trips and to purchase new learning resources.
- Provide mental health and well-being support where appropriate.

If your financial circumstances have changed, your child may be eligible for a free school meal. Please contact the school office who will be able to email the eligibility checking form to you.

Food Waste Disposal



Key Dates for Spring Term 2


- Non-Uniform Day: Friday 21st March. To support the Friends' colour raffle. More information to follow.
