Parental Expectations and Conduct

It saddens me to write this section of the newsletter, especially as so many families and parents speak positively about the school. However, there are growing concerns regarding discussions among some groups of parents. I am aware that other local schools are also facing similar issues concerning parental behaviour towards school policies, procedures and staff.

We are incredibly fortunate at our school to have a strong, stable team of dedicated staff who strive to provide the best possible education for your children. Many go above and beyond to ensure we take part in sporting events, often giving up their personal time to do so. The quality of education at our school is high and standards across the school are consistently good.

However, in recent weeks, several parents and carers have taken to WhatsApp, engaged in playground discussions and voiced concerns to other parents in a manner that is sometimes negative, rude, or disrespectful towards staff and the school. Some staff members have also experienced direct rudeness, challenges to their professional decisions, and general disrespect from parents. Understandably, this has left them feeling upset - particularly when they are working hard to support all the children and are deeply committed to the school community.

It appears that discussions are taking place about other children's behaviour, how staff manage behaviour, the support provided for children and the allocation of places on sports teams, among other topics. While we acknowledge that parents naturally talk, we must emphasise that not all the information being shared is accurate or appropriate. If you are involved in such discussions, we ask you to reflect on the impact of this and be mindful that much of what is said often finds its way back to the school.

As a school, we find this behaviour unacceptable and it is becoming increasingly damaging to both our community, the staff team and the teaching profession as a whole. All other professions have clear boundaries and while we recognise that we may not always meet every parent's expectations, we work exceptionally hard to do our best, always keeping the children at the heart of what we do.

Parents and carers may not always be fully aware of how schools operate, the provisions in place, and the time and effort required to ensure children have a wider range of opportunities, make progress, feel safe, and feel valued. Our staff work tirelessly with the resources available to them and we ask that this is respected.

We live in a society where we teach children to be respectful and responsible and we kindly ask that parents support us in setting this example by working collaboratively and respectfully with all school staff.

About: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756 – 1791) was a prolific and influential composer of the Classical period. Despite his short life, his rapid pace of composition resulted in more than 800 works of virtually every genre of his time. Many of these compositions are acknowledged as pinnacles of the symphonic, concertante, chamber, operatic, and choral repertoire. Mozart is widely regarded as among the greatest composers in the history of Western music. His Requiem was largely unfinished by the time of his death at the age of 35, the circumstances of which are uncertain and much mythologised.
