We still have a high number of children who are not reading at home or out of school. This does impact on their progress through the curriculum. Please make sure you spend 5-10 minutes at least three times per week reading with your child. Caring for Creation – Planet Protectors



As part of our school vision to 'care for creation' and also in line with our developments, we have a group of children who are committed to leading change across our school. Our aim is to be more sustainable and look at ways of protecting our planet.

This week our 'Planet Protector' group have met to discuss improvements for this year. They have suggested we work on the following...

- Planting pollinating plants in spring and summer.
- Looking at ways in which we can make compost from our green waste.
- Creating bug friendly areas around the school grounds.
- Promoting and encouraging a 'walk to school week' to reduce traffic and emissions.
- Reducing the use of single use plastics in school and improving our recycling systems.
- Having 'Eco Monitors' in each class to ensure lights are turned off and that bins are used correctly.



Following on from their meeting, the Planet Protectors went on a walk and collected litter in our local area. They will continue to meet on a monthly basis and encourage other children to share ways in which we can make a difference.

Animal Care – Visit from Maggie



This week we had a visit from Steph and Maggie the Greyhound who is currently residing at Animal Care. As already mentioned, our school vision teaches the children about caring for creation.

Steph led an assembly for the whole school about responsible pet ownership and talked about the work of Animal Care in Lancaster. She then visited Turnstones and Dunlins classes for a further question and answer session.

Keeping Safe Online – Accessing Inappropriate Content

This week our focus is 'Inappropriate Content'. "Inappropriate" means different things to different people. What's perfectly acceptable for one age group, for example, may be highly unsuitable for a slightly younger audience. Online, young people can chance upon inappropriate content in various ways – from pop-up ads to TikTok videos. The increasingly young age at which children become active in the digital world heightens the risk of them innocently running into something that they find upsetting or frightening. Trusted adults need to be able to help children to be aware of what to do if they're exposed to age-inappropriate content. (National College)
