We would like to extend a big thank you to The Friends, all the parents and staff members who helped make Thursday nights Discos such an enjoyable experience for the children.



NSPCC Workshop in Y2

As part of our PSHE curriculum, Year 2 children will be taking part in the **NSPCC Speak Out Stay Safe** workshop, which will be delivered by Mrs Rigby. This programme is designed to help children understand how to keep themselves safe and what to do if they ever feel worried or unsafe.

The session will cover:

- Understanding feelings and recognising when something doesn't feel right.
- Identifying trusted adults who can help.
- Knowing the importance of speaking out if they feel worried or unsafe.
- Introduction to Childline and how it can support children.

The workshop is age appropriate, engaging and delivered in a sensitive way to empower children without causing alarm. It is part of their education and we are informing you in case the children talk about the sessions at home. If you have any questions about the session, please speak with Mrs McGirl or Mrs Rigby.
