Headteacher Message

Good Afternoon,

We hope everyone has had a lovely week. We have recently undertaken a thorough review of individual children's attendance at school. We know there has been a number of illnesses over the past few months and this will be accounted for, as we know that this can't be helped. We do, however, have a number of children who are 'persistently absent' and this is impacting significantly on their education. We carefully monitor attendance and in line with our policies there may be occasions where the staff team will carry out home visits to check on children / families. Letters will be sent home to acknowledge absences which are becoming a cause for concern, with a view to raising awareness and offering the opportunity to support and work alongside families to improve attendance.

Our Skylark (Reception class) have had a wonderful week! They have been celebrating Chinese New Year in class and have had a special visit from Mr Lane (Parent and Postman) who talked to the children about his job. All of our Reception children then went on a local walk to the post box to post some of their letters and also gave school all of their mail. Thank you to Mr Lane for coming in to teach the children about your role.

This week Oystercatchers have been on a local walk and visited Judge's Lodgings as part of their History curriculum. They had a wonderful time and it was fantastic to hear all about their historical learning and the knowledge they gained!
