Afterschool and Breakfast Club

As we are approaching the end of the school year, we need to know the number of children who will require places at our Breakfast and Afterschool club provision, ensuring we can fulfil the staffing ratio requirements. Our numbers on both wraparound care teams have been increasing and as a school we need to make sure adequate staffing levels are in place. If the number of children exceed our staff ratio, we may need to limit spaces which is something we really do not want to do.

All forms for Breakfast and Afterschool Club should have been sent home with all children who currently attend these clubs. For anyone wishing to request a place for their child(ren) in Autumn Term 2024 who do not already attend, please collect a copy from the school office. Please ensure all forms for Autumn Term 2024 are returned **by the end of today** (Friday 5th July) at the very latest.

We also need to ensure that all remaining balances are **fully cleared** by the end of the summer term (Tuesday 23rd July). If you have any outstanding balances on either Breakfast or Afterschool club by the time you request your place for next term, we will be unable to confirm your place until the balance has cleared which may impact your child attending in September. Upcoming Trips and ParentPay

Alongside all the other wonderful activities going on across school this term, we have a number of school trips and ParentPay will look rather busy in line with these activities. **We need to ensure parents have completed all trip documentation including lunch orders, at least 2 weeks prior to trips taking place. The school kitchen have to order the food in advance to ensure they have enough to cater for the packed lunches.**

We still have outstanding consent and information for children in Reception and Y1 who have trips coming up. If this information is not completed for your child at least two weeks prior to the trip, they may have to remain in school. We have rigorous checks to undertake prior to trips taking place and parental consent is key to enabling your child to be taken off the school premises.

The majority of our trips now have parental consent, emergency contact, medical, allergy and lunch choice information required to be processed via ParentPay, in addition to payments (where applicable) so that all information is kept in one central place.

Please check on ParentPay to see if you have any outstanding items that require attention.

You should have a paper copy (and in some cases, an electronic copy) available for all trips which will contain deadline dates for ParentPay to be completed. If you have lost this, please contact the school office for another and we will happily provide one.

Many thanks for your cooperation in ensuring we can run trips smoothly and have all details available in good time!



Music Curriculum Developments Does your child want to learn to play an instrument?

Thank you to the parents who have sent in their interest for music lessons for their child/ren. If you are interested and haven't yet informed us, please email the office by Monday 8th July. We will then collate this information and ascertain costs and feasibility.



As part of our music curriculum developments, we are looking at wider opportunities for children to learn instruments. We have two music teachers who are interested in delivering music tuition. This can be delivered as a small group or 1:1. At this stage we are only seeing if this is something of interest. As lessons, should not impact on the learning curriculum and would have to be either lunchtime or after school.

One teacher can teach ukulele, keyboard, drums, guitar or music technology. We have been provided with details from another teacher who delivers guitar / ukulele. Any additional music tuition of this nature would have to be fully charged to parents.

General Reminders

Passing on messages / communication with staff

Over the last week we have had an increase in parents wanting to speak to staff and coming to the school office hoping to be seen immediately during drop-off - our busiest time of the day. The school diary is extremely busy at present and staff are not always available to meet. We kindly ask that you email or call the office after 9am when all children are settled in school, to request a call or meeting and we will aim to have someone respond, hopefully within the day.

Hair

We are noticing more children with long hair coming to school without this being tied back. Please ensure you tie your child's hair back if it can fit in a bobble to avoid headlice transfer and minimise risks when playing / undertaking sports activities.

Uniform

We only have just over 2 weeks left of the school year. We are aware that as we approach the end of the school year, children are growing out of their school shoes or their school shoes are becoming worn / damaged. We do not expect any parent / carer to be buying new school shoes at this time of the year. We therefore have some flexibility with footwear until the new school year. Please ensure your child does not wear open toe sandals. Trainers / PE trainers can be worn where school shoes have been damaged or are too small.

Hats and Suncream

Please ensure your child brings a clearly labelled sunhat and has suncream applied before school. You are welcome to send a **labelled** bottle of suncream into school, provided your child is confident in applying this themselves.

Lost Property
