	Caverswall and Cookshill are steeped in history, ideal for exploring the sights				
	and attractions of the Staffordshire Moorlands and the various fabulous				
	pottery museums and 'potbanks' of Stoke-on-Trent: affectionately known as				
	'The Potteries'. The Foxfield Railway, which is also close by, was built in 1892-				
	1893 to provide a link to the national railway network for the now closed				
	Foxfield Colliery. The railway, to this day, has steam engines running at				
	weekends and this is a very popular tourist attraction. Now run by volunteers,				
	it serves to remind you of Caverswall's connection with its industrial past.
