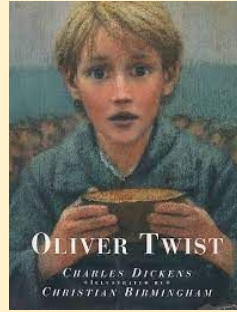


Year 4 Autumn 2 Curriculum Newsletter



Complete Mathematics

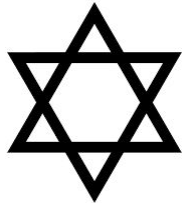
