

Thank you, Mrs Miles, for kindly donating a selection of water colours to school.



The Art of Maths Workshop:


Wednesday 4th March

Children are invited to come to school dressed up as their favourite character, or non-uniform if you prefer not to. We can't wait to see your fantastic costumes!




Story in a Jar Competition:
