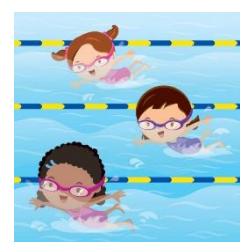
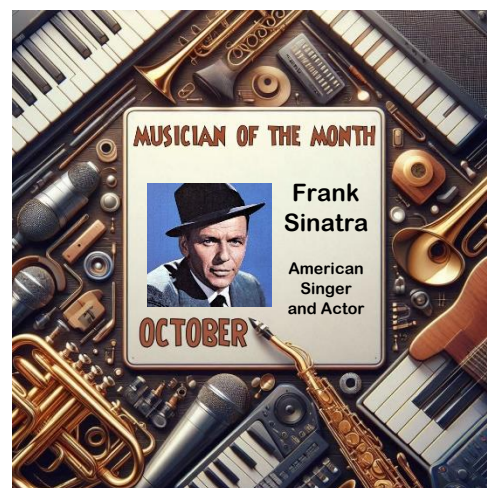

St. Peter's Primary School, Bromyard PTFA AGM Minutes

30th September 2025.

Present: 4 members of staff, 7 Parent/Guardians

Committee Roles: Chair-Paul Geoghegan, Secretary-Alice Beale, Treasurer-Christy Hall. These official roles are appointed at each annual general meeting and approved by members.

Treasurer Report: Sept 2024 opening balance = £2912.05

Sept 2025 current balance = £2397.50 (£580 Ring-fenced for Pond project)

2024-2025 Funds raised = £3515

Money was raised from: Ice lolly sales, Christmas shopping event, Halloween and Christmas Discos, Christmas cards, Film night, Asda cashpot, Bingo, Summer gala. There was also a Yr5/Yr6 Enterprise which raised funds to go towards the Pond regeneration project.

2024-2025 Expenses = £4569.85

Funds raised by the school and PTFA were used for: A number of tablets to aid learning for pupils, Pantomime company, All Stars.

Resolutions: It was resolved to create a PTFA info page to include the name "Friends of St. Peter's" and logo design by pupils, Continue Parentkind subscription (which includes PLI for the PTFA events and useful resources), Host Halloween and Christmas Discos, Host Christmas Film nights for KS1 and KS2, Work towards other fundraising opportunities throughout the school year.

Aims for the year: To include sourcing St. Peter's branded sports kit for school teams to wear at tournaments etc. More tech/IT equipment for use in school. Help towards funding the Pond regeneration/Forest school areas. Promote PTFA and encourage more members.

Fundraising ideas: Adult pub quiz night, Light up the night trail, Christmas cards, film nights, auction of promises, Christmas Fete/Fair/Craft fair
