Terms of Use Policy for St. Peter's Plus After School Clubs

St. Peter's teachers, teaching assistants and other helpers provide their time free of charge to organise and run a range of St. Peter's Plus extra-curricular after school clubs: they have no contractual obligation to do so and the school relies on their goodwill to be able to operate our St. Peter's Plus clubs free of charge to parents.

We therefore ask that pupils and parents respect the after school club provision by adhering to the following agreement.

- Children must only be enrolled for clubs that they genuinely want to attend and clubs must not be used by parents as child care where the child has no interest or wish to attend.
- 2. When enrolling for an after school club, the child makes a commitment and must agree to attend every session unless they are ill. The practice of allowing children to 'quit' part way through a course of after school clubs or for parents to allow children to 'dip in and out' is not acceptable.
- On the rare occasion that a child is ill, they will not have been in school that day and the school will acknowledge that as a genuine reason for absence from a club and know in advance that they will not be attending.
- 4. On the very rare occasion where a child cannot stay for the club for a genuine reason e.g. they have a medical appointment after school, the parent must make direct contact with the School Office to register the absence from the club in the same way that they notify the school when a child is absent from school. A message through any other means e.g. the home liaison book or word of mouth is not acceptable. This is to ensure that the teacher in charge of the club knows exactly who should be present at that club through the Club Register and can therefore safeguard the children property.
- 5. Good behaviour during any afterschool club is expected and should be treated as if you were in a classroom environment. Children will not be invited to attend club if they do not behave as expected.
- 6. Children who sign up to clubs are committed to attend every session (with exception of illness). If 2 weeks of club is missed consecutively without notice or a specific reason then their place will be withdrawn and made available to others on the waiting list.
- 7. Appropriate kit must be worn for club. If a sports kit is not provided, your child will not be able to take part.

IMPORTANT

Attendance at clubs should be viewed as part of the school day and children will not be allowed to go home before the end of the club, for any reason that has not been properly notified directly to the School Office.
