During the school day bikes and scooters can be stored within the fenced area at the front of the school (by the offices).



## Sun Cream Policy

We recommend that parents apply 'all day' sun cream to their children before school on summer days. We strongly request that sun cream is not sent in to school for children to apply themselves: it is our experience that this is an unsatisfactory arrangement leading to cream not being properly applied and other health and safety concerns.

School staff are not normally at liberty to apply sun cream to children. In exceptional circumstances, where it is not possible (e.g. due to special needs) for a child to use 'all day' cream, parents are requested to contact the school to make special arrangements.

The warm weather means lots of outside opportunities in school so please make sure your child has sun lotion on, wears a sun hat and brings in a water bottle.
