## New Behaviour System

This week we have introduced a new weather themed behaviour chart system in to each classroom. Your children may have spoken to you about it.

The chart is not about bad behaviour, it is about positive reinforcement.

There are three stages to the chart:

- 1. Bright sunshine all children start each new day on the sunshine
- 2. Cloudy sunshine if a child has been issued with a warning then they will move to the cloudy sunshine
- 3. Grey cloud a second warning will mean moving to the grey cloud and a chat with an adult

If there is no improvement, the child will be referred to a senior member of the team where they will take time out and together they will complete a 'fresh start agreement'

Why is a reward system important?

Tracking positive behaviours is a great way to motivate pupils and encourage them to meet personal goals. It also helps influence continued good behaviour until it becomes habitual. Reward systems promote fairness and equality in the classroom by showing that everyone is working towards the same targets.

This is about positive reinforcement and ALL children start their day on sunshine.
