Reading:

- How many words can you find beginning with the letter 'm'?
- Can you read books with woodland animals in the story with a grown-up? Draw a picture your favourite story – try and describe why.
- Look and listen to the story Ssh! We have a Plan by Chris Haughton

Try to answer these questions with an adult's help.

- What are the people in the story trying to do?
- What are they using to catch the bird?
- Why can't they catch the bird?
- What does the little person do?
- Which part of the story do you like best?
- Can you draw, paint or make your own exotic bird?

Phonics:

Each day please also complete handwriting practise and phonics activities.

- Handwriting: Throughout this week please practise all 'Zigzag Letters': v, w, x, z You need to write each letter lots of times to practise it. Make sure you start and finish the letter in the correct place. How many three- and four-letter words can you make with v, w, x, z. Try to find 5 words and then beat your record!
- Phonics: Use the 'Phonics Play' website – you can access free games for your children. We are working on phase 2 and 3 in school. The website is: <https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/> but it can also be accessed by typing 'phonics play' into Google. On YouTube, Mr Thorne does phonics is another particularly good website. <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize> offers a variety of phonics and literacy activities.

Writing:

The Alphabet



- Can you practise writing the alphabet?
- Can you write the alphabet in lower-case letters and capital letters?
- Can you match and write capital letters and lower-case letters? E.g. Aa, Bb
- How many letters are there in the alphabet?
- What letter comes before “r”?
- What letter come after “h”?
- What is the first letter of the alphabet?
- What is the last letter of the alphabet?
- What is the third letter of the alphabet?

Maths

- Using small toys e.g. cars, little people, counters etc Can you partition a set of 10 objects and learn pairs of 10. Can you make pairs of 20?
- Can you make a number sentence using +, = e.g. $2+8=10$, $3+7=10$
- Can you count forwards 10, 20, 30, 50, 100 and backwards from the same numbers?
- Re visit the days of the week. Can you name the days of the week in the correct order? Use these words to make a sentence yesterday, today, tomorrow.
- Learn o’clock and half past the hour. Link it to times in the day. Can you draw a picture and write a sentence? I go to bed at 7 o’clock. I eat my lunch at 12 o’clock. Ask an adult to help you.

Topic - Woodland

- Think carefully about what you have learned so far about forests and woodlands. Discuss with an adult. Draw a picture and write a few sentences about your favourite animals or things that you like about the forest.
- Look at trees in your garden and in your street or in the park. Can you identify them?
- Which tree is the most common?
