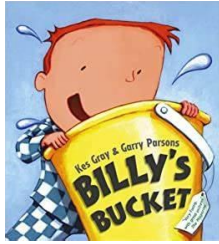


Nazareth Rooms Home Learning week beginning 01.06.2020

Our Topic this half term is Under the sea

Reading:

- Find books with stories about animals who live under the sea. Here are some titles to start with. The Rain bow Fish by Marcus Pfister, The Fish who could wish by John Bush, Commotion in The Ocean by Giles Andreae.
- Over the next two to three weeks we will be reading Billy's Bucket. Please follow the link below.

- Discuss with an adult why Billy's mum and dad tried to put him off getting a bucket for his birthday. What suggestions did they make?
- Where did Billy go to buy his bucket?
- Name and write down in you can all the different types of buckets that you can find.
- What kind of bucket would you buy and why?

Phonics:

Each day please also complete handwriting practise and phonics activities.

Handwriting: Throughout this week please practise all 'curly caterpillar letters': c, a, o, g, d, e, q, s, f. You need to write each letter lots of times to practise it. Make sure you start and finish the letter in the correct place.

- How many words can you find beginning with the letter 'd'?
- Phonics: Use the 'Phonics Play' website – you can access free games for your children. We are working on phase 2 and 3 in school. The website is: <https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/> but it can also be accessed by typing 'phonics play' into Google. On YouTube, Mr Thorne does phonics is another particularly good website. <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize> offers a variety of phonics and literacy activities.

Writing:

- Can you write your name and address?
- Can you draw a picture and write the names of all the people in your family?
- Learn to read and write these tricky words. Can you write a sentence with each word?

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- Can you write a sentence describing this picture? Discuss with an adult how to look after a goldfish. Can you write some instructions?



Maths

- Do you have buckets in your home? Gather the buckets that you have at home, with the help of an adult investigate, the size, the material it is made from, the colour and the pattern. Design your



own bucket.

Here are some to get you

- Where can you find numbers around your home? Make a list of household items with numbers on them. E.g. Clock, watch, etc...
- Keep practising your counting and writing of numbers 10, 20, 30, 50 and 100. Can you make number patterns using a number of objects? E.g. 3 cars in a line from left to right. 3 cars in a vertical line from top to bottom. Can you do the same with different numbers and objects?
