## <u>Literacy</u> – Spelling, grammar and writing

• To read our writing back to an adult.

We continue to focus on the use of capital letters and full stops in simple sentences and will also be learning about:

- How to write capital letters
- Using capital letters for names
- Using capital letters for days of the week
- Using capital letters for months of the year
- Plurals adding -s and -es eg books, boxes
- To use the simple past tense when writing eg "I went/ I saw".

#### **Mathematics**

## We continue to work on the following:



- To sing number songs (eg 5 currant buns in the baker's shop)
- To recognise numbers 1-10 (and then 11 20 when confident to 10)
- To count sets of objects (to 10 and then to 20)
- To read, write and order numbers 1-10 (and then 11 20)
   When children are confident with numbers to 20 we work on numbers to 30, 50,100 in that order.
- Learning to add and subtract using cubes, number lines to 20 and a 100 square.
- Recognise and naming shapes.
- Ordering by size.

#### During the Spring term we will also be learning about:

- Measuring
- Halving (shapes and numbers)
- Recognising and continuing patterns and number sequences eg 1,4,7,1,4,7
