December 15th - 3rd Sunday in Advent

December 22nd - 4th Sunday in Advent

We learn in this Gospel that Jesus will be born of Mary, the betrothed of Joseph, a son of David.

December 25th - Christmas Day

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.

December 28th - Feast of the Holy Family

Take the child and his mother, and flee into Egypt.
