January 8th - Baptism of the Lord This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.

January 15th - 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time John the Baptist proclaims Jesus, "Behold the Lamb of God".

January 22nd ⁻ 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Jesus calls Peter and Andrew to be fishers of men.

January 29th - 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time Jesus teaches the Beatitudes. "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."
