We have the wonderful feasts of Mary, Mother of God, where we honour Mary's highest title, and then we follow the Magi to the crib as they bring their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh on Epiphany. ### Focus of the Liturgy – Sunday Mass

The Gospel readings for the Sundays in January during the Christmas season follow the annual readings from St Matthew, St Luke, and St John. The remaining Sunday Gospels in ordinary time are taken from St Luke following the Lectionary Cycle C.

January 2<sup>nd</sup> - Epiphany of the Lord We learn in this Gospel about the three Kings visiting the baby Jesus.

January 9<sup>th</sup> - Baptism of the Lord This Gospel tells us how Jesus was baptised by John in the Jordan.

January 16<sup>th</sup> - 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time This Gospel relates the Wedding at Cana.

January 23rd <sup>-</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time Jesus speaks in the synagogue in Nazareth. "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

January 30<sup>th</sup> - 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time Jesus says, "No prophet is accepted in his own native place."
