Activity of the Month – Pentecost Wheel

Create a Pentecost wheel as a reminder that the Holy Spirit is working in all our lives. After you have made it, begin to use it seven days before Pentecost. You could share with your family a gift of the Holy Spirit each night. A Pentecost wheel is a round circle divided into as many sections as you wish – you can create your own ideas for each section. Praying, singing, listening etc.

Focus of the Liturgy – Sunday Mass

The Gospel readings for the Sundays in May are taken from St John and are from Year A, Cycle 2 of the readings.

May 2nd - 5th Sunday of Easter In this Gospel Jesus tells us that he is the vine and we are the branches.

May 9th - 6th Sunday of Easter Jesus gives us the commandment to love as he loves.

May 16th - Ascension Sunday Jesus instructs his disciples to preach the Gospel to the whole world.

May 23rd ⁻ Pentecost Sunday In this Gospel we learn how Jesus gives his disciples the power to forgive sins.

May 30th - Trinity Sunday We learn in this Gospel that Jesus tells the apostles to "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

<u>Pentecost</u>

Pentecost, the birth of the Church, is also among the celebrations in May. Though sprung from the side of Christ on the Cross, the Church marks as her birthday the descent of the Holy Spirit on Mary and the Apostles. At the 'birth' of the world, the Holy Spirit – the Breath of God – was the "mighty wind that swept over the waters" (Genesis 1:2); at the birth of the Church He is present again "like the rush of the mighty wind" to recreate the world in the image of Christ through His Church (Acts 2:2).

Come upon us, O Holy Spirit, so that, with Mary we may proclaim the greatness of the Lord who has done great things for us – for his mercy endures forever!
