and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.

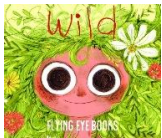
Holy Mary, Mother of God,

### Reading:

- How many words can you find beginning with the letter ‘i’ can you find?
- With a grown-up, play a listening game about a visit to a farm, ‘I went to the farm and I saw...’ – instead of saying the animal name, split the word into 3 letter sounds. The other person has to identify the animal by blending the sounds together. For example ‘I went to the farm and I saw a ‘c-a-t.’ ‘It’s a cat!’
- Read stories about woodland animals. Discuss with your family which book you like best and why
- Look and listen to the story Wild by Emily Hughes.

- Discuss the Title page, what does Wild mean?
- Draw/copy the picture of the girl from the front page. Write a description of her.
- Using only natural materials design and make a comfortable bed for the girl to sleep in.
- Design a toy for her to play with using twigs, leaves etc.

### Writing:

- Categories: Name and write down 5 vegetables, 5 colours, 5 fruits, 5 woodland animals, 5 farm animals, 5 pets.
- Name five things that:
  - Smell nice
  - Feel soft
  - Are red
  - Are green
  - Are prickly
- Using **First, next, last** answer these questions
  - How do you make a cheese sandwich?
  - How do you get to school?
  - How do you wash your hands?

- Handwriting: Throughout this week please practise all 'ladder letters': l, I, t, u, j, y. You need to write each letter lots of times to practise it. Make sure you start and finish the letter in the correct place.

- Practise counting and writing numbers every day.

- Make a shop of your choice – groceries, toy shop, farm shop etc. Make a poster for “Special Offers”

- Draw a mouse to the left of the cat.



- Draw an owl to the right of the hedgehog.
- Ask your family to draw some other examples. Use your toys to play right and left games.
- Using a pack of playing cards pick two cards. Which number is the highest, which is the lowest? Pick two cards can you make 10 or 21.
- Choose two cards. What two digit numbers can you make? Make it harder by choosing three cards. Can you add the numbers together? Make the highest number you can? Make the lowest number you can?
- Play snap and pairs. Make your own adding and subtraction sums.
