Dear Parents and Friends,

I hope that you are all keeping safe and well.

As I said in my letter to you yesterday, despite the fact we are in a National lockdown, St Peter's continues to be a very positive and happy place for the children to learn. The staff are committed to both the children's wellbeing and their academic progress.

We continue to regularly review all our safety controls in school. If you or your children develop any of the coronavirus symptoms, you must go for a test before the children are able to return to school. Please ensure only one adult per family comes to the school site to drop off or collect children.

Keeping warm in school

As we have to keep the school well ventilated, children are being encouraged to bring in a top layer, for example a fleece or a tracksuit jacket to be worn over their uniform. Ideally this top layer will have a zip so it is easy to remove if children get too warm, but it will be more comfortable than wearing their coat inside. It can be any colour, but please make sure this item is labelled with your child's name.

Reception 2021

If you have a child born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017, they will be eligible to start full time school in September 2021. The admissions process will begin on 1st November 2020 and will close on 15th January 2021. Information packs will be available from the school office from 2nd November.

Bike and Scooter Safety

Some children are still riding their bikes and scooters on the school premises. This could become a safety hazard. Please make sure your child dismounts at the school gate on the way to school. On the way home please ensure they do not get back on their bike or scooter until they have passed through the school gate. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding in this matter.

Attendance

Our whole school attendance since we came back in September was 96.6% which was amazing considering the current situation. For October, we have improved and our attendance is 97.66%, so well done and thank you to all our families!

Breakfast Club and After School Club

We still have spaces in both clubs. If you are interested, registration forms can be picked up from the office, downloaded from the website or you should have received them by email yesterday. Both clubs are COVID-19 safe and your child will remain in their year group bubble. Breakfast Club costs £2.50 per session and After School Club costs £9 per session, all payable on your child/children's Parent Pay account.
