I usually get up at 6am. When I wake up I wash my face and read religious books. Then I do my homework. At 7.30am I have breakfast.

At 8am I go to school.



The **walk to school** takes **Nitu** and her **friends** about **20 minutes**.





English is my favourite subject.
I am at the top of my class at
school. I feel very happy and proud.
I study a lot.


When **Nitu** was **six years old** she **fell over** and **broke her leg** while she was **playing** some **games**. **Doctors** tried to **treat her** but there were some **complications** and since then her **leg** hasn't **worked properly**.
