Welcome back! This half term, we will be covering the following areas. If you have any questions then please do get in touch.

<p align="center"><b>Mathematics</b></p> <p>In Maths, the children will be learning about 'Multiplication.' This topic includes each of the following, and a good understanding and a fluent recall of times tables facts is vital:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- multiplication</li> <li>-division</li> <li>-fractions</li> </ul> <p>In school, children will be solving a range of arithmetic problems and questions that require reasoning and explanations.</p> <p>Children should continue to practise their times tables at home.</p>	<p align="center"><b>English</b></p> <p>This half term we will be reading 'Fire, Bed and Bone', an atmospheric tale of the Peasants' Revolt told from the viewpoint of a dog which makes comments about the society and issues of the time, in the language of the time.</p> <p>This strong narrative raises serious issues for discussion and brings an important historical event alive. It links with our history topic about the Middle Ages.</p> <p><b>Overall aims of this teaching sequence:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To introduce pupils to a novel this raises serious issues for discussion and brings an important historical event alive.</li> <li>• to develop children's responses to a book through discussion.</li> <li>• To provide opportunities for children to write in role, exploring different viewpoints.</li> <li>• To explore the historical setting of the story through preparing information texts and non-fiction writing.</li> <li>• To use drama and role-play to deepen children's understanding of a book.</li> </ul> <p>Grammar and punctuation: relative clauses, tenses, dialogue, prefixes, noun phrases, standard English.</p>	
<p align="center"><b>Computing</b></p> <p>In the coming weeks the children will be learning about spreadsheets. They will be using a formula wizard to add a formula to a cell to automatically make a calculation in that cell. They will be learning to use a spreadsheet to model a real-life situation and answer questions.</p>	<p align="center"><b>Science</b></p> <p>We will be learning about materials and their properties in science lessons. We will be investigating how materials change, including processes of dissolving, separating mixtures and reversible and irreversible changes.</p>
