Dear Parent,

Your child will be working on the following curriculum during this term.

Mathematics

In maths this term the children will be learning about multiplication, fractions and decimals. The topics covered include:

- Multiplication up to 12 x 12
- Multiplying and dividing mentally
- Multiplying together three numbers
- Recognising and using factor pairs
- Multiplying two digit and three digit numbers by a one digit number using the formal written method.
- Solving word problems based on multiplication
- Finding the area of rectilinear shapes

The children will also be learning the following:

- Equivalent fractions
- Counting in hundredths
- Adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator.
- Recognising and writing decimal equivalents of fractions.
- Dividing one digit and two digit numbers by 10 or 100.

We ask that the children practise their times tables at home. Completing homework (given out Friday and due in Monday) is also important in aiding the children in their understanding of these topics. If you require any help please don't hesitate in seeing any Year 4 teacher.

States of Matter

In this unit children will compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases. They will also observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled, and measure or research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C). We will also explore Identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle and associate the rate of evaporation with temperature.

Human Nutrition
In this unit, pupils will describe the simple functions of the basic parts of the digestive system in humans.
They will Identify the different types of teeth in humans and their simple functions.

P.E

In PE this term the children will be learning an array of ball skills, including offensive and defensive skills, in the sports of netball, tennis and hockey. Children will also learn about creating and using space in dance.

Music

During music lessons, the children will learn to sing, play, improvise and compose with the well-known song, Mamma Mia. Children will listen and appraise more hits from the band, ABBA.

In the second half term, the children will develop their understanding of the language of music through playing the glockenspiel.

History

Who's that waving axes and brandishing swords? In the second half term, we will be conducting our own research into Anglo-Saxon and Viking daily life, through the use of a variety of primary and secondary sources.

		The children will analyse and draw some replica artefacts. We will find out why the Vikings caused the Anglo-Saxons such trouble, and decide just how 'great' Alexander the Great was. Finally, we will discover how London changed throughout this era of history.	
Geography Mighty mountains rise above the morning mists, imposing and eternal. During this half term, we're going up in the world, conducting our own research about the various mountains and mountain ranges on our planet. We'll use a range of maps as well as information books and websites to find out about these geographical features. During this topic, we will learn about the Alps and Andes mountain ranges that sprawl across much of Europe and find out about the flora and fauna found there. We will also learn about the mountains and peaks of the United Kingdom, and write postcards about these locations. Finally, the children will sequence the stages of a volcanic eruption.	In the first half term, the children will be learning about tone. They will discover how artists create light and dark in their sketches and paintings. Looking at the impressionist movement and taking inspiration from Paul Cezanne, the children will paint mountain scenes based on the famous artwork, 'Mount Saint-Victoire'. In the second half term, we'll make boats fit to sail the ocean's fearsome waves. We will evaluate the design features of a Viking longboat, and apply the engineering processes behind them to our own models. The children will create their own Viking longboats, historically accurate in design, which feature a moving sail via a pulley system and oars that move via a lever system.	French This term, the children will be learning how to hold conversations in French about animals. They will also learn the vocabulary and grammar required to be able to express their hobbies and preferences.
