Each half-term will focus on a different branch, the themes of these are;

The programme is planned to be fully in place by September 2026, and so we are currently introducing it to each year group over a planned time scale, in accordance with the guidance from the Brentwood Diocese.

During this half term the children in EYFS and KS1 will be learning about Creation and Covenant.

Nursery - In this branch, pupils will encounter the God who creates and calls a people.

Reception- In this branch, pupils will encounter the God who creates and calls a people.

Year 1 – In this branch, the focus is revelation (how God is revealed/shown to His people on Earth).

Year 2 – In this branch, the focus is Baptism. Baptism is the meeting point where people are reborn to a new life in Christ and become part of the Christian community
