Your child will be working on the following curriculum during this term. Please feel free to talk to the Class teacher about any area of this curriculum.

Mathematics In the Spring Term we will be teaching children to add and subtract numbers within 20 (and above for a challenge!) and develop our knowledge of place value further by focusing on numbers up to 50. This will include representing, comparing and ordering numbers to 50 as well as looking at the tens and ones. As well as this, children will start to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. We will also be learning about length, height, weight and volume, where we will be comparing the difference between measurements.
