- Sentence challenge! – Write all of the verbs that you find in the paragraph below, into your home learning books.

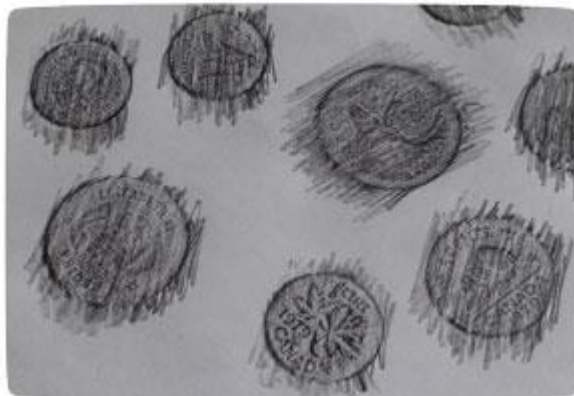

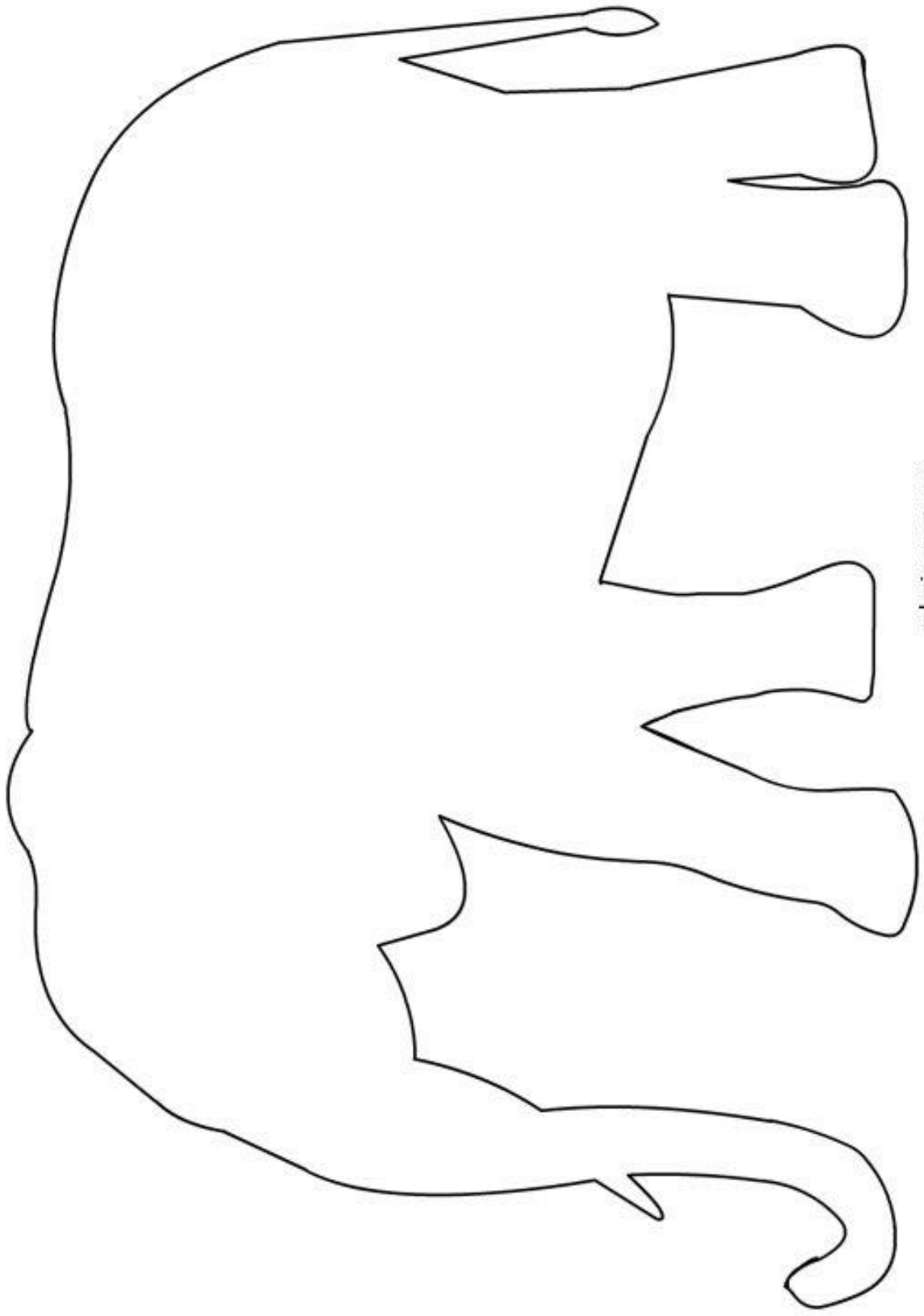
