

<u>Reading</u>



- Reading helps children to build up a vocabulary and provides them with a wealth of ideases they can then use in their writing. It is proven that good readers become good writers.
- Children are expected to be reading every day at home with an adult and their books are to be signed. Reading books will not be able to be changed unless they are signed.
- Adults should be questioning their child's understand of the text as they read this is a big part of the year 2 curriculum.
- The difficulty of children's reading books will increase but the comprehension and understanding is the main importance.
- Children will also be receiving a library book that they can keep for a week and swap for another the following week.



<u>Maths</u>

- read scales* in divisions of ones, twos, fives and tens
- •partition any two-digit number into different combinations of tens and ones, explaining their thinking verbally, in pictures or using apparatus
- add and subtract any 2 two-digit numbers using an efficient strategy, explaining their method verbally, in pictures or using apparatus (e.g. 48 + 35; 72 17)
- recall all number bonds to and within 10 and use these to reason with and calculate bonds to and within 20, recognising other associated additive relationships (e.g. If 7 + 3 = 10, then 17 + 3 = 20; if 7 3 = 4, then 17 3 = 14; leading to if 14 + 3 = 17, then 3 + 14 = 17, 17 14 = 3 and 17 3 = 14)
- recall multiplication and division facts for 2, 5 and 10 and use them to solve simple problems, demonstrating an understanding of commutativity as necessary
- identify 1 4, 1 3, 1 2, 2 4, 3 4, of a number or shape, and know that all parts must be equal parts of the whole
- use different coins to make the same amount
- read the time on a clock to the nearest 15 minutes
- name and describe properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes, including number of sides, vertices, edges, faces and lines of symmetry.



<u>SATs</u>

This is no longer a compulsory statutory requirement for Year 2. It is likely that we will still be completing some SATs-style assessments in school but this will be 'inhouse'. Further information will be given early next year.

Usually...

- Tests will take place during the month of May
- 2 comprehension tests
- 2 maths tests
- Handwriting

<u>Homework</u>

- Homework will be given out every Friday and is due in by the following Tuesday
- The homework that is being sent home supports the children's learning for that week in school so it is really important that it is being completed each week.
- Homework will consist of:
 - Weekly spellings
 - 1 piece of Maths
 - 1 piece of English


Behaviour Policy

Rewards

- We are using the same behaviour system as last year, go for gold.
- Every child starts on green and will get opportunities throughout the day to move up to Bronze, Silver and Gold.
- Children will receive a matching coloured sticker as a reward which they can put onto their sticker chart in class/take home.

Sanctions

• For undesirable behaviour children will receive a green verbal warning. If they continue with the behaviour they will be moved to yellow and sent into the other class for a time out. If behaviour continues they may receive an alternate lunch and will be sent to Mrs Scott. You will be informed if this does occur.
