People Children will be able to compare their own and others' ideas about the questions that family trees raise and are difficult to answer. Geography Mountains Mighty mountains rise above the morning mists, imposing and eternal. During this half term, we're going up in the world, conducting our own research about the various mountains and mountain ranges on our planet. We'll use a range of maps as well	Art/DT In the first half term, the children will be learning about tone. They will discover how artists create light and dark in their sketches and paintings. Looking at the impressionist movement and taking inspiration from Paul Cezanne, the children will paint mountain scenes based on the famous artwork, 'Mount Saint-Victoire'.

During this topic, we will learn about the Alps and Andes mountain ranges that sprawl across much of Europe and find out about the flora and fauna found there. We will also learn about the mountains and peaks of the United Kingdom, and write postcards about these locations. Finally, the children will sequence the stages of a volcanic eruption.	French Through the teaching of French, Year 4 pupils will develop their listening, speaking, reading and writing skills and learn to express themselves with increasing confidence, independence and creativity. Ultimately, we want our pupils to possess a love of languages, and we aim to achieve this by nurturing a linguistic curiosity and an intrinsic motivation to explore and respect other cultures and people.
PSHE Being Me in My World Throughout this unit children will build confidence and resilience to enable them to know that their attitudes and actions make a difference to the class team They will delve deep into understanding who is in their school community, the roles they play and how they fit in. This will develop into an understanding in how democracy works through the School Council and in our lives outside of school. By the end of the unit children will have a sound understanding of how their actions affect themselves and others and deepen their empathy for others.	Computing This half term we will be exploring 'coding' in ICT. Children will learn to use selection in coding with the 'if/else' command and understand and use variables in 2Code. We will develop an awareness of flowcharts for design of algorithms including selection, P.E In PE this term the children will be building upon their problem- solving skills through partaking in outdoor and adventurous activities. In gymnastics, they will develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance. They will learn an array of ball skills, including offensive and defensive skills in basketball and football lessons.
Music We will be studying a range of music made by The Beatles. The Beatles helped to reshape Western pop music in the 1960s and are one of the most successful bands ever. The Beatles had four members: John Lennon, Paul McCartney, George Harrison and Ringo Starr.
